
# SB 248 Liquor License Fee Increase for Revenue Generation

### License Fees Amongst Lowest in Nation

Licensing fees for stores, bars, breweries and wineries have been unchanged since 1949 and do not reflect the cost of administering the alcohol licenses they were intended to regulate. New license types mirrored existing fee schedule.

Oregon's alcohol fees are amongst the lowest in the nation

Raises \$9.2 million for 2019-21

Revenue will be applied to agency operations supporting alcohol licensees, compliance, and offset the use of other liquor funds that can be distributed to the state, cities and counties

- Upgrades in infrastructure and information technology
- Licensee education
- Increased minor decoy operations

### Oregon Ranks Nationally Near the Bottom in Alcohol License Fees

Fee change would bring Oregon closer in-line to national averages
