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


Out of State Levels of Care

- Level of care and clinical needs assessments have been completed by the Oregon Health Authority contractor Comagine Health for each youth placed out of state.
- Contractor Findings
 - Youth are placed in appropriate levels of care
 - A couple of youth may require a higher level of care
 - A summary report from Comagine Health is expected by the Department this week

Current Status of Out of State Placements

- To date, 76 youth remain in PRTS or BRS programs out of state
- Facility safety visits and youth face to face visits continue. Updates and details are available on our legislative webpage
- DHS Licensing and Treatment Services staff are following up with Red Rock on an ongoing basis to ensure safety of Oregon youth.



Next Steps for Comprehensive Planning

- Utilizing the capacity and service matching research provided by the Office of Research, Reporting, Analytics and Implementation (ORRAI)
- Youth transitions to Oregon
- Working with OHA, CCOs and our partners to build capacity and end the need for out of state placements
