Chair Dembrow and Members of the Committee: My name is Rhett Lawrence and I'm the Conservation Director for the Oregon Chapter of the Sierra Club. On behalf of the more than 25,000 Sierra Club members in Oregon, I am pleased to submit these comments in support of House Bill 2834.

As an organization with a long history of working to protect wildlife in our state, we believe HB 2834 – the Wildlife Corridor and Safe Road Crossing act – would be a major step toward providing state agencies with mechanisms to both protect wildlife and reduce vehicle-wildlife collisions across our state. As you are no doubt aware, such collisions cost Oregonians millions of dollars each year and usually end with a wildlife death and human injury. Taking steps to remove barriers to animal migration and create safe road crossings and wildlife corridors is a common-sense way to reduce those impacts on wildlife and Oregon citizens.

The Sierra Club believes that House Bill 2834's provisions for ODFW and ODOT to create a Wildlife Corridor and Safe Road Crossing Action Plan is a great first step toward implementing the protections we need in Oregon. We therefore strongly support this bill and urge Committee members to do the same.
