Subject: HB 2328 - Relating to unauthorized use of a vehicle

HB 2328 modifies the mental state required to prove a person has committed the crime of unlawful use of a vehicle (UUV). Passage of the bill is expected to increase the number of felony cases filed in circuit courts, and the number of felony convictions for UUV.

The measure is expected to result in minor, absorbable costs for the Oregon Judicial Department, Oregon Youth Authority, district attorneys, and cities and counties. However, the Oregon Department of Corrections (DOC) and the Public Defense Services Commission (PDSC) have indicated there may be a need for budget adjustments in 2019-21 to cover their costs.

In light of uncertainty regarding the magnitude and timing of the bill's impact on DOC and PDSC, the Legislative Fiscal Office recommends the establishment of a $\$ 1$ million special purpose appropriation in the Emergency Board bill to address any potential fiscal impacts on these agencies in the coming biennium. If HB 2328 is passed, the special purpose appropriation will be included in SB 5507.

The LFO recommends adoption of the measure.
