Subject: $\quad$ SB 22 - Relating to behavioral health homes

SB 22 amends statutes relating to the Patient-Centered Primary Care Home (PCPCH) program to include behavioral health homes, requiring the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to establish a program to identify, monitor, and regulate behavioral health homes. In addition, the bill updates language changing primary care home "certification or accreditation" to primary care home "identification."

OHA estimates the fiscal impact of this bill to be $\$ 560,500$ Total Funds [ $\$ 325,054$ General Fund and $\$ 235,446$ Federal Funds], and 2 positions (1.76 FTE) for the 2019-21 biennium; and $\$ 615,284$ Total Funds [ $\$ 358,514$ General Fund and $\$ 256,770$ Federal Funds], and 2 positions (2.00 FTE) for the 2021-23 biennium. If approved the corresponding General Fund appropriation and increase in Federal Funds limitation will be included in the agency's 2019-21 budget bill (SB 5525).

The measure previously had a hearing in the Senate Committee on Human Services on $3 / 26 / 2019$ and was reported out with a do pass recommendation.
