**Subject:** SB 23 – Relating to data submitted to the Oregon Health Authority by health care facilities

SB 23 authorizes the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to obtain discharge records from hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, and extended stay centers. The measure permits OHA to charge fees to ambulatory surgical centers to defray the costs of compiling and abstracting these records. OHA is required to notify entities submitting data of changes to data sets no later than July 1 of calendar year preceding effective date of changes. The measure also allows OHA to contract with a third party to receive and process these records.

OHA estimates the fiscal impact of this measure to be \$150,000 General Fund per biennium to contract with an outside vendor to compile, process, and abstract discharge data from required entities. If approved, the General Fund appropriation will be included in the agency's 2019-21 budget bill (SB 5525).

The measure previously had hearings in the Senate Committee on Health Care on 2/27/2019 and 3/11/2019, and was reported out with a do pass recommendation.
