I question the sanity of SJM 11 and oppose it.

SJM 11 urges Congress to require candidates for federal elected office to disclose relevant portions of federal tax return to appear on the ballot.

What is "relevant portions" of a federal tax return?

The bill states: "Whereas the American people should have confidence that their federally elected representatives are working solely for the interests of the American people and not for their personal financial interests."
