Their experience in the farm/garden classroom is positive and beneficial; they are more engaged and feel more able to express themselves in an interactive outdoor environment.

These kids are making some of the best food I have eaten in my 2 decades working in hospitality! And they are making food that has a positive benefit to their health, learning and focus.

The farm to school program is giving farms and food a future in the lives of kids who will become our leaders.

The impact it is having on young lives is advantageous to our society to the utmost degree.
