SUBCOMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

HB 2333 Relating to recreational vehicles

HB 2333 clarifies the difference between recreational vehicles, which are titled and registered with the Oregon Department of Transportation, and park model recreational vehicles (also known as "tiny homes on wheels"), which are more than eight and a half feet wide and may be titled, but not registered, with ODOT. The measure removes regulation of recreational vehicles from the Department of Consumer and Business Services.

The recommended amendment, which replaces the measure, includes recreational vehicles that are more than eight and a half feet wide in the definition of manufactured structures for property tax purposes and makes other technical changes.

The Department of Consumer and Business Services estimates a revenue reduction of \$571,032 in the 2019-21 biennium to its Recreational Vehicle and Manufactured Housing Inspection Programs. ODOT would incur some costs to implement the titling and registration changes but they are expected to be minimal.

The Transportation and Economic Development Subcommittee recommends HB 2333 be amended by the -A3 amendment and be reported out do pass, as amended.
