Chair Holvey, Co Vice-Chairs Williamson and Wilson, and Members of the House Committee on Rules:

My name is Julia Yoshimoto and I am a member of the Oregon Commission for Women (OCFW), whose role is to advocate for the women in Oregon. I am also the Project Director and Attorney for the Women's Justice Project at Oregon Justice Resource Center (OJRC).

The OCFW thanks you for the important message within SCR 25 for survivors of sexual violence and raising awareness of their challenges and needs. The Commission has a long history of supporting such efforts and is deeply committed to seeing this bill pass.

At the most recent Commission meeting, the OCFW discussed SCR 25 and wishes to propose an addition/amendment to the bill wording that would further recognize the prevalence of sexual violence in the personal histories of incarcerated women and "survivor-defendants", women who are survivors of sexual violence, who are defendants in criminal proceedings. This group is largely overlooked and endures additional trauma through criminal systems not set up with women in mind. The suggested amendment:
