The Program Evolves...

1985-2010

- 1985 Legislature implements OG Program
- 1987 Program fee increased to \$50
- 1989 Program to sunset in 1990, repealed, Charter Licensing Passed
- 1993 Guide Association highlights illegal guiding
- 1999 \$150 fee, biennial registration proposed, fails
- 2007 Reciprocal fees set to sunset, repealed
- 2009 Limited entry proposed, fails

The Program Evolves...

1985-2010

- 2011 GAC leads strategic development process
- 2013 Comprehensive legislation redefines Guides & Charters, sets 2016 motorboat requirement
- 2013/14/15 Rulemaking, major updates
- 2015 HB 3498 adds sex offender and certain drug violations
- 2016 MPBOC implemented in rulemaking
- 2017 HB 2883 extends revocation to 60 months

Overview

- Outfitter & Guide: Any person who, for compensation, provides outfitting and guiding services on land or water they do not own or solely control.
- Outfitting & Guiding Services: Leading, protecting, instructing, training, packing, guiding, interpreting, or otherwise assisting any person in the conduct of outdoor recreational activities.
- Activities Include: Boating, angling, hunting, backpacking, mountain climbing, camping, rafting trips, kayak trips, Jeep tours

Primary Activities

- Land-based guiding
 - Hunting, backpacking, mountaineering, jeep tours, etc.
- Water-based guiding
 - Fishing, wildlife viewing, education
- Charters (7 or more passengers)
 - Ocean charters, inland charters for fishing, ecotourism

Primary Focus – Fishing & Rafting

- Navigable Waterway Guides USCG licensing
- Inland Waterway Guides MPBOC requirement
- Non-motorized Boat Guides
- White Water Guides



Charter Boat Operations

Charter Boat Program

- 7 or More Passengers for Hire
- Boats are USCG Inspected for all federally navigable waterways
- Inland Waterways: USCG Licensed Operators, State Inspected Vessels
- Lower Columbia reciprocity with Washington charters

Future Priorities

Legislation to Enhance Industry, Protect Public

- Charters
 - Charter is licensed separately from operator
 - Operator registers as Outfitter Guide (one free per boat)
 - Create Deck Hand classification, \$25 fee (now must be a guide)
- Non-Resident Hunt Tags
 - High-value tags: current bonding is inadequate
 - Employee definition: Some guides game the system

Future Priorities

Legislation to Enhance Industry, Protect Public

- Non-resident Fee: Reciprocity violates federal commerce clause
- Crowding: Is it time to "cap" guide numbers; how?
- Improve "ethics & etiquette" enforcement
- Sub-account: Move from General Fund
