Measure Description:

Expands higher education tuition grants offered to qualified members of Oregon National Guard by permitting grant to be used for undergraduate degree program at Oregon Health and Science University or qualifying private post-secondary institutions or for program or curriculum designed to lead to certificate of completion at community college, public university, Oregon Health and Science University or qualifying private post-secondary institution.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Oregon Military Department (OMD), Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs (ODVA), Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC)

Summary of Fiscal Impact:

Costs related to the measure are indeterminate at this time - See explanatory analysis.

Analysis:

Current law provides grants to eligible members of the National Guard to supplement state and federal financial aid for degree-seeking undergraduate students at public universities and community colleges. The program is in its first year of operation. The Higher Education Coordinating Commission administers the program using General Fund dollars appropriated for this purpose.

This bill expands the grant program to eligible National Guard students at private educational institutions and Oregon Health and Science University, as well as to certificate of completion programs at any of the eligible institutions. Based on information currently available, the 2019-21 budgeted amounts for grants under this program could be sufficient to cover the increased demand anticipated with passage of this bill. If demand for the program outpaces the budgeted amount for 2019-21, the agency may need to return to the Emergency Board for additional resources.

Higher Education Coordinating Commission

The Higher Education Coordinating Commission can absorb an increase in workload associated with the increased participation in this grant program within its current budget.
