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**Measure Description:**

Directs State Resilience Officer to study condition of buildings after emergency and determine whether buildings may be safely occupied.

**Analysis:**

The measure would require the State Resilience Officer to study standards and procedures for determining whether buildings may be safely occupied after an “emergency,” as defined in ORS 401.025. The standards would need to align with national standards. In conducting the study, the State Resilience Officer would be required to consult with local governments, relevant state agencies or offices, including the State Fire Marshal, and relevant professional organizations, including organizations representing architects, engineers, and building safety professionals.

The measure appropriates \$300,000 General Fund to the Office of the Governor in the 2019-21 biennium to carry out its provisions, including hiring a Principal/Executive Manager G position (1.00 FTE).
