

RE: AKC Supports Amendments to SB 723, Protecting Dog Field Trials and Hunt Testing

Representative Holvey and Members of the House Committee on Rules:

The American Kennel Club writes today regarding Senate Bill 723. As introduced, the bill would have prohibited field trials and hunt testing in Oregon, and possibly hunting in general.

The American Kennel Club was established in 1884 and promotes the study, breeding, exhibiting, and advancement of purebred dogs. We, along with our 5,100-affiliated clubs nationally, advocate for the purebred dog as a family companion, advance canine health and wellbeing, protect the rights of dog owners, and promote the ideals of responsible dog ownership. As the world's largest purebred dog registry, the nation's largest purebred rescue network, and the only not-for-profit purebred dog registry devoted to the health and wellbeing of all dogs, the American Kennel Club actively advocates for humane treatment of *all* dogs.

We understand the amendments to the bill are included in the version the Committee is considering on June 18, 2019. This language will focus the legislation on hunting contests involving coyotes. While we are most appreciative for the amendments, and the many positive changes made to protect the rights of hunters and sportsmen, we urge caution for legislation that can erode hunting traditions.

We also respectfully ask that the committee consider a further amendment that specifically clarifies that dog field trials and hunt testing will continue to be protected in Oregon.
