

SUBCOMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

HB 2333

Relating to recreational vehicles

HB 2333 clarifies the difference between recreational vehicles, which are titled and registered with the Oregon Department of Transportation, and park model recreational vehicles (also known as “tiny homes on wheels”), which are more than eight and a half feet wide and may be titled, but not registered, with ODOT. The measure removes regulation of recreational vehicles from the Department of Consumer and Business Services.

The Joint Committee on Ways and Means previously approved this bill, and it has passed the House.

The -B4 amendments resolve conflicts with SB 410. That bill, which has been enacted into law, terminated DCBS regulation of the construction of recreational vehicles and modified the definition of “recreational vehicle” in various statutes. The conflict amendments make various technical fixes to the bill by modifying the definitions of “park model recreational vehicle,” “recreational vehicle,” “manufactured dwelling,” “manufactured structure,” and “mobile home park” to conform with SB 410.

I recommend HB 2333 be amended by the –B4 conflict amendments and be reported out do pass, as amended.
