## Measure Description:

Extends sunset on pilot program to decrease rates of school absenteeism by using trauma-informed approaches to education, health services and intervention strategies.

Analysis: The bill would extend the Trauma Informed Practices pilot program through June 30, 2021. In addition, the bill transfers responsibility for the program to the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) from the Chief Education Office that ceases to exist as of June 30, 2019 and extends the due dates of various reports from October 2019 to June 30, 2020 (preliminary report) and the final report due on June 30, 2022.

The agency's budget includes policy option package 105 that requests $\$ 1$ million for Grant-In-Aid and 2 positions/1.42 FTE that provides continuation and expansion of the current Trauma Informed Pilot project. The resources to staff this bill are anticipated in Policy Option Package 105 in ODE's budget. Resources will be used to assist with research design, collection, analysis reporting, scheduling, meetings, and maintaining project documentation.

There is no fiscal impact to school districts.

This measure warrants a subsequent referral to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means for consideration of its budgetary action for the allocation of General Fund resources and position establishment.
