BACKGROUND:

Chief John Joseph Brazil was a pillar of the Harbor, Brookings, and Gold Beach communities. He passed away on August 15, 2018.

Chief John Joseph Brazil was born in Sacramento, California, to Mary and Joe Brazil, and grew up with his three sisters, Victoria, Susan, and Peggy. After graduating from Norte del Rio High School in Sacramento, Chief Brazil married his school sweetheart, Patra Richardson, and together they raised two daughters, Laura and Lynn.
