## WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires Oregon Department of Education (ODE) develop statewide education plan for students in early childhood through post-secondary education who are Latino or Hispanic, and experienced disproportionate results in education due to historical practices. Directs ODE to convene advisory group to develop and implement plan, establish eligibility criteria, and adopt rules for implementation. Establishes membership of advisory group and components plan must address. Requires ODE submit biennial report every even numbered year to interim committee of Legislative Assembly. Requires ODE award grants to early learning hubs, providers of early learning services, school districts, post-secondary institutions, and community-based organizations, to implement strategies in plan. Allows ODE to develop grant criteria in rule. Requires ODE submit report on development of statewide plan no later than January 1, 2020. Requires ODE implement statewide plan and make expenditures for grants after July 1, 2020. Declares emergency, takes effect July 1, 2019.

## **BACKGROUND:**

In 2015, House Bill 2016 directed the Oregon Department of Education to develop and implement a statewide education plan for African American/black students who are in early childhood through post-secondary education programs. The bill also directed ODE to convene an advisory group comprised of members of the African American community and stakeholders. The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) also develops a statewide plan for American Indian/Alaska Native students. ODE also convenes advisory groups to formulate these plans.
