Recognizes and honors Sergeant First Class Richard Joseph Henkes II (1973-2006) for his service to his country.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Life and service of Sergeant First Class Henkes

BACKGROUND:

Richard Joseph Henkes II was born and raised in Boring, Oregon. As a student he participated in wrestling and track and field at Clackamas High School, graduating in 1992. Following graduation, he enlisted in the United States Army in 1992 and served in the National Guard for years before re-enlisting in the regular Army, making him the fourth generation of his family to serve. He was killed in action by an improvised explosive device that detonated near his vehicle on September 3, 2006, and was laid to rest at Willamette National Cemetery.
