WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Redirects civil forfeiture proceeds from the Oregon 529 College Savings Plan Subaccount to an account established or designated by the State Treasurer in the higher education qualified tuition savings program of the Oregon 529 Savings Network. Retains use of ten percent of civil forfeitures for disbursement to scholarship programs for children of public safety officers who were killed or disabled in the line of duty.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Inadvertent routing of funds into administrative account
- Redirect funds to correct account
- Funds in administrative account will be deposited into correct account
- History of scholarships for children of law enforcement officers who are disabled or killed in the line of duty

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

A college scholarship fund exists for children of public safety officers killed or disabled in the line of duty. The scholarships are for the cost of tuition and fees and are for four years of higher education. Currently, the scholarship program is funded by ten percent of civil forfeiture proceeds. That amount is deposited into the Oregon 529 College Savings Account.

House Bill 2286 redirects the money from civil forfeitures into an account specified by the State Treasurer for higher education qualified tuition savings programs of the Oregon 529 Savings Network.
