WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Recognizes and honors Sergeant First Class Scot R. Noss for his service to his country.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Life and times of Scot R. Noss

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Born in Lebanon, Oregon, in 1977, Scot Noss attended Queen Anne Elementary School and Lebanon Middle School before graduating from Lebanon Union High School in 1996, where he was a standout football player. He fulfilled his lifelong dream to become an Army Ranger, participating in eight deployments in Afghanistan and Iraq. A traumatic brain injury, suffered in a helicopter crash in Afghanistan in 2007, resulted in an honorable medical discharge after 11 years of service.

Lebanon High School has inducted Sergeant First Class Noss into its Hall of Fame. The library at Pioneer School in Lebanon is named in his honor.
