WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Directs State Board of Education (SBE) to ensure that content standards for history, geography, economics, and civics include instruction on the histories, contributions, and perspectives of individuals who are Native American; of African, Asian, Pacific Island, Chicano, Latino or Middle Eastern descent; women; immigrants or refugees; lesbian, gay, bisexual, or transgender; or have disabilities. Requires SBE to review and revise existing content standards to comply with new requirements by September 30, 2024. Requires school districts to offer instruction that meets the academic content standards no later than 2026-2027 school year. Stipulates that a school district may offer instruction prior to 2026-2027 school year, as specified. Eliminates requirement that respect for all peoples, regardless of race, color, creed, national origin, age, sex, or disability and their contributions to our history and system of government be reflected in the textbooks adopted by the SBE. Adds requirement that district school boards, SBE, and textbook committees or officers adopt textbooks and other instructional materials that adequately address the roles in and contributions to the economic, political, and social development of Oregon and the United Sates by men and women who are Native American; of European, African, Asian, Pacific Island, Chicano, Latino or Middle Eastern descent; immigrants or refugees; lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender; or have disabilities. Makes textbook requirements operative on September 30, 2026. Requires Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to provide professional development to teachers and administrators relating to the academic content standards and textbook selections during the 2026-2027 and 2027-2028 school years. Permits ODE to contract for the provision of professional development.

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

BACKGROUND:

ORS 329.045 requires SBE to review and revise its Common Curriculum Goals, performance indicators, and diploma requirements to include rigorous academic content standards. Oregon law requires school districts and public charter schools to provide instruction that meets these standards. House Bill 2023 A requires SBE to ensure that academic content standards include sufficient instruction on histories, contributions, and perspectives of certain classifications of individuals. It also directs school districts to offer instruction that meets the academic content standards; ODE to provide professional development to teachers and administrators related to the new requirements; and school districts, SBE, and textbook committees or officers to adopt textbooks and other materials that adequately address the roles in and contributions of certain classifications of individuals. The bill aligns the implementation dates for the new requirements with SBE's regular adoption cycle for standards, textbooks, and materials.
