WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Provides conditions under which Department of Transportation may issue registration plates for a vehicle to a car rental company in cases where the application does not include primary ownership record. Allows Department to charge additional fee for this service, the amount of which is to be determined by the Department by rule. Directs Department to adopt rules to carry out provisions of measure.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Issues with registering vehicles that may be located in other states
- Instances of fees being determined by rule

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Car rental services have been available in the United States since the early 1900s. Companies rent vehicles to drivers at an hourly or daily rate. In Oregon, drivers can rent from national car rental companies and smaller local businesses. Car rental companies operating in Oregon are required to register vehicles with the Oregon Department of Transportation and are subject to registration fees.

Senate Bill 807-A authorizes the Department of Transportation to accept applications and issue registration plates to car rental companies without primary ownership records.
