SUMMARY

Directs Early Learning Division to develop plan for ensuring children seamlessly transition between mental health services.

Directs division to submit plan to Governor and report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2020.

Sunsets January 2, 2021.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to plan for mental health services for children; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) The Early Learning Division shall develop a plan for ensuring that children seamlessly transition from mental health services targeted for children under six years of age to mental health services targeted for children six years of age or older.

- (2) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the division in the performance of the division's duties under this section and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice that the division considers necessary to perform the duties of the division under this section.
- (3)(a) The division shall submit the plan developed under this section to the Governor no later than September 15, 2020.
- (b) The division shall report on the plan developed under this section in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to early childhood no later than September 15, 2020.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2, 2021.

SECTION 3. This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect on its passage.
