**SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

*[Requires that commercial product that contains or is derived from cervid urine and designed for luring, attracting or enticing cervids be from herd free of chronic wasting disease.]*

**Makes legislative findings regarding commercial cervid attractants as source of chronic wasting disease. Prohibits possession and use of commercial cervid attractants.**

**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

2 Relating to chronic wasting disease.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2019 Act is added to and made a part of the wildlife laws.**

5 **SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:**

6 (a) **"Chronic wasting disease" means a type of spongiform encephalopathy that is**  
7 **transmissible among cervids and typified by chronic and fatal weight loss.**

8 (b) **"Commercial cervid attractant" means a marketed product that contains or is derived**  
9 **from cervid urine and is designed for use in luring, attracting or enticing a cervid.**

10 **(2) The Legislative Assembly finds and declares that:**

11 (a) **Commercial cervid attractants sometimes contain the source of chronic wasting dis-**  
12 **ease;**

13 (b) **There is no reliable test for determining the presence or absence of chronic wasting**  
14 **disease in commercial cervid attractants; and**

15 (c) **Banning the possession and use of commercial cervid attractants will reduce the**  
16 **threat to the cervid population of this state from chronic wasting disease.**

17 **(3) A person may not possess or use commercial cervid attractants.**
