

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2332

- 1 In line 3 of the printed bill, after “418.041” insert “and 418.043”.
- 2 Delete lines 5 through 24 and insert:
- 3 “**SECTION 1.** ORS 418.041 is amended to read:
- 4 “418.041. (1) The Governor’s Child Foster Care Advisory Commission is established[,
5 *consisting*].
- 6 “**(2) The commission consists** of *[11]* **13** members appointed by the Governor.
- 7 “[*2*] **(3)** The term of office of each member of the commission is four years, but a member
8 serves at the pleasure of the Governor. Before the expiration of the term of a member, the Governor
9 shall appoint a successor whose term begins on July 1 next following. A member is eligible for re-
10 appointment. If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an appointment to become
11 immediately effective for the unexpired term.
- 12 “**(4) Notwithstanding subsections (2) and (3) of this section, if a member of the commis-
13 sion is a representative of the Judicial Department, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court
14 shall appoint that member.**
- 15 “[*3*] **(5)** The appointment of each member of the commission **who is appointed by the Gover-
16 nor** is subject to confirmation by the Senate in the manner prescribed in ORS 171.562 and 171.565.
- 17 “[*4*] **(6)** A member of the commission is entitled to compensation and expenses *[as provided in
18 ORS 292.495.] in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for compen-
19 sation and expenses incurred in performing the functions of the commission shall be paid out
20 of funds appropriated to the commission for that purpose.*
- 21 “**SECTION 2.** ORS 418.043 is amended to read:
- 22 “418.043. (1) The members of the Governor’s Child Foster Care Advisory Commission must be
23 residents of this state with experience and expertise in the foster care system in this state, including
24 but not limited to:
- 25 “**(a) Current or former** foster *[and biological]* parents and **current or former foster** children
26 *[involved in the foster care system in this state]*;
- 27 “**(b) Family members of individuals described in paragraph (a) of this subsection;**
- 28 “**(c) Biological parents involved in the foster care system in this state;**
- 29 “[*b*] **(d)** Representatives of advocacy organizations that advocate regarding issues pertaining
30 to the foster care system in this state;
- 31 “[*c*] **(e)** Representatives of public, private, profit and nonprofit agencies, organizations and
32 other entities with experience in, interest in and responsibility for the provision of care to children
33 in the foster care system in this state;
- 34 “[*d*] **(f)** Members of the Oregon State Bar with expertise in family and juvenile dependency
35 law;

1 “[(e)] (g) Representatives of law enforcement agencies and district attorneys;

2 “[(f)] (h) Former employees of the Department of Human Services, Oregon Health Authority and

3 Department of Justice who were responsible for the administration and oversight of the child wel-

4 fare and foster care systems in this state, including but not limited to former caseworkers and for-

5 mer court appointed special advocates;

6 “[(g)] (i) Representatives of the Judicial Department [*in consultation with the Chief Justice of the*

7 *Supreme Court*]; and

8 “[(h)] (j) Representatives of federally recognized Indian tribes in Oregon and organizations

9 serving Native Americans.

10 “(2) The members of the commission shall select one of the commission’s members to serve as

11 chairperson and another to serve as vice chairperson, for terms and with duties and powers neces-

12 sary for the performance of the functions of the offices as the commission determines.

13 “(3) A majority of the members of the commission constitutes a quorum for the transaction of

14 business.

15 “(4) The commission shall meet at least once every three months at a time and place determined

16 by the chairperson of the commission. The commission also may meet at other times and places

17 specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the commission.

18 “(5) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the

19 commission in the performance of the commission’s duties, powers and obligations and, to the extent

20 permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information that the members of the com-

21 mission consider necessary in order to further the work of the commission. [*The assistance under this*

22 *subsection may constitute the provision of staffing resources to the commission.*]

23 “**(6) The Department of Human Services shall provide the commission with the necessary**

24 **clerical and administrative staff support, including, at a minimum, one full-time equivalent**

25 **(FTE) policy analyst.**

26 “**SECTION 3. There is appropriated to the Governor’s Child Foster Care Advisory Com-**

27 **mission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of**

28 **\$_____ for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of ORS 418.041.”.**

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
