SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services [for payment to Douglas Timber Operators] for purpose of implementing first phase of sediment study of lower Rogue River.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to department for payment to Umatilla County to reimburse water right holders for increased pumping costs of surface water that is used in lieu of ground water.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2019.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$452,390 to solicit bids and contract for the implementation of the first phase of a sediment study of the lower Rogue River at a management cost of no more than six percent of expenditures.

SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,000,000 for Umatilla County to reimburse water right holders for the increased pumping costs of surface water that is used in lieu of ground water.

SECTION 3. This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect July 1, 2019.
