AN ACT

Relating to CASA Volunteer Programs.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1. (1)(a) No later than July 1, 2020, the Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall conduct a review of CASA Volunteer Programs, as defined in ORS 184.489, in this state, including a review of the department’s July 31, 2018, Oregon Court Appointed Special Advocate Programs Evaluation Report and the differences in operations between CASA Volunteer Programs resulting from county-specific administration of child welfare programs by the Department of Human Services and differences in county court requirements.**

**(b) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services may consult with the Judicial Department, the Department of Human Services, the Department of Justice, CASA Volunteer Programs, the office of public defense services, and any other agency the Oregon Department of Administrative Services determines appropriate in conducting the review under this subsection.**

**(2) No later than September 15, 2020, the Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall submit a report to the appropriate interim committee of the Legislative Assembly with the results of the review and recommendations for legislation to address the problems identified by the department, including recommendations for operational best practices and increasing standardization of operations to the extent practicable.**
