House Bill 2638

Sponsored by Representative SANCHEZ; Representative NOSSE (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Modifies membership and chairperson of Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission.

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 430.241, as amended by section 3, chapter 44, Oregon Laws 2018, is amended
5	to read:
6	430.241. (1) As used in this section and ORS 430.242:
7	(a) "Participating state agency" means the Department of Corrections, the Department of Hu-
8	man Services, the Oregon Health Authority, the Department of Education, the Oregon Criminal
9	Justice Commission, the Oregon State Police, the Oregon Youth Authority or any other state agency
10	that is approved by the Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission to license, contract for, provide or
11	coordinate alcohol or drug abuse prevention or treatment services.
12	(b) "Provider" means any person that is licensed by the Oregon Health Authority to provide
13	alcohol or drug abuse prevention or treatment services.
14	(2) There is created the Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission, which is charged with improving
15	the effectiveness and efficiency of state and local alcohol and drug abuse prevention and treatment
16	services.
17	(3) The membership of the commission consists of:
18	(a) At least 12 but no more than 16 members appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation
19	by the Senate in the manner prescribed in ORS 171.562 and 171.565[. The Governor shall appoint
20	members] and appointed, as the Governor deems practicable, to ensure representation from public
21	health and health care stakeholders directly impacted by the work of the commission[. In making
22	the appointments, the Governor shall consider representatives of], including:
23	[(A) District attorneys;]
24	[(B) County sheriffs;]
25	[(C)] (A) County commissioners, managers and administrators;
26	[(D)] (B) Indian tribes;
27	[(E)] (C) Providers of [alcohol and drug abuse] addiction prevention and [treatment] recovery
28	services;
29	[(F) Chiefs of police;]
30	[(G)] (D) Alcohol or drug treatment researchers or epidemiologists;
31	[(H) Criminal defense attorneys;]
32	[(I)] (E) The health insurance industry[,] or hospitals [or coordinated care organizations]; [and]

1	[(J)] (F) Consumers of [alcohol and drug abuse prevention and treatment] addiction recovery
2	services who are in recovery and the family members of consumers[.];
3	(G) The following providers of addiction prevention and recovery services:
4	(i) Treatment providers employed by an outpatient addiction treatment program;
5	(ii) Directors of inpatient addiction treatment centers;
6	(iii) Addiction treatment providers who are culturally competent to serve specific cul-
7	tural or ethnic populations;
8	(iv) Certified prevention specialists;
9	(v) Certified addiction counselors; and
10	(vi) Certified addiction recovery mentors; and
11	(H) Experts in addiction medicine.
12	(b) Two members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the commission as nonvoting mem-
13	bers of the commission, acting in an advisory capacity only and including:
14	(A) One member from among members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate;
15	and
16	(B) One member from among members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker
17	of the House of Representatives.
18	[(c) A judge of a circuit court appointed to the commission as a nonvoting member by the Chief
19	Justice of the Supreme Court.]
20	(c) The director of the behavioral health program of the Oregon Health Authority, as a
21	nonvoting member.
22	(d) A representative of a coordinated care organization, appointed by the Governor, who
23	is a nonvoting member.
24	(4) [The Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission shall select one of its members as chairperson and
25	another as vice chairperson, for such terms and with duties and powers necessary for the performance
26	of the functions of such offices as the commission determines] The Director of the Alcohol and Drug
26 27	of the functions of such offices as the commission determines] The Director of the Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission shall serve as a nonvoting chairperson of the commission.
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
