House Bill 2810

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to Historic Portland Public Market Foundation for predevelopment expenses for James Beard Public Market.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2019.

Relating to the James Beard Public Market; and declaring an emergency.

3	Whereas the James Beard Public Market is a proposed permanent, daily, year-round, indoor
4	outdoor food market and public gathering place in Portland; and
5	Whereas the market will feature a food hall with more than 50 vendors that will showcase the
6	quality and diversity of Oregon's farming and food economy; and
7	Whereas the market's community center will feature a learning kitchen and classes on cooking
8	healthy eating and wellness; and
9	Whereas the foundation seeking to establish the market expects to incur predevelopment cost
10	of \$1.2 million in 2019 and 2020; now, therefore,
11	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
12	SECTION 1. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri
13	ated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the biennium beginning July

SECTION 1. In addition to and not in fieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$400,000 for distribution to the Historic Portland Public Market Foundation to be used for predevelopment expenses for the James Beard Public Market.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect July 1, 2019.
