## House Bill 2816

Sponsored by Representative KENY-GUYER; Representatives NOSSE, REARDON, Senators DEMBROW, GELSER, GOLDEN

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes Task Force on Integrated Pest Management to study coordination of integrated pest management in public universities and state agencies. Requires report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to public health not later than September 15, 2020.

Sunsets December 31, 2020.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to pest management; and prescribing an effective date.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Integrated Pest Management is established.

5 (2) The task force consists of 11 members appointed as follows:

6 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint:

7 (A) Two members from among members of the Senate.

8 (B) Two members who have expertise in pest management in public universities and state

9 agencies.

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10 (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint:

11 (A) Two members from among members of the House of Representatives.

- (B) Two members who have expertise in pest management in public universities and state
   agencies.
- 14 (c) The Governor shall appoint three members of the public who have a professional in-15 terest in pest management.
- (3) The task force shall study the coordination of integrated pest management in public
   universities and state agencies.

(4) The task force may request research assistance from any state agency or public uni versity as determined necessary by the task force.

20 (5) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the 21 transaction of business.

(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting
 members of the task force.

24 (7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.

(8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint ment to become immediately effective.

- (9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson
  or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.
- 29 (10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

1 (11) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and 2 may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative 3 Assembly related to public health no later than September 15, 2020.

4 (12) The State Department of Agriculture shall provide staff support to the task force.

5 (13) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are nonvoting 6 members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity only.

(14) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not
entitled to compensation or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task
force.

10 (15) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist

the task force in the performance of the duties of the task force and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task

13 force consider necessary to perform their duties.

14 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on December 31, 2020.

15 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2019 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2019
 16 regular session of the Eightieth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
