House Bill 2836

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Extends sunset for pilot programs that use trauma-informed approach to decreasing rates of school absenteeism.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for pilot programs. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

5	SECTION 1. Section 6, chapter 68, Oregon Laws 2016, is amended to read:
6	Sec. 6. [Section 5 of this 2016 Act is repealed on January 2, 2020] Section 5, chapter 68, Oregon
7	Laws 2016, as amended by section 1, chapter 137, Oregon Laws 2017, is repealed on January
8	2 , 2022.
9	SECTION 2. There is appropriated to the Department of Education, for the biennium
10	beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$2.5 million for the purpose
11	of carrying out the provisions of section 5, chapter 68, Oregon Laws 2016.
12	SECTION 3. This 2019 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2019
13	regular session of the Eightieth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
