

House Bill 2836

Sponsored by Representative DOHERTY

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Extends sunset for pilot programs that use trauma-informed approach to decreasing rates of school absenteeism.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for pilot programs.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to chronic absences; creating new provisions; amending section 6, chapter 68, Oregon Laws
3 2016; and prescribing an effective date.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** Section 6, chapter 68, Oregon Laws 2016, is amended to read:

6 **Sec. 6.** [*Section 5 of this 2016 Act is repealed on January 2, 2020*] **Section 5, chapter 68, Oregon**
7 **Laws 2016, as amended by section 1, chapter 137, Oregon Laws 2017, is repealed on January**
8 **2, 2022.**

9 **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated to the Department of Education, for the biennium
10 beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$2.5 million for the purpose
11 of carrying out the provisions of section 5, chapter 68, Oregon Laws 2016.

12 **SECTION 3.** This 2019 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2019
13 regular session of the Eightieth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
