SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Directs Department of Transportation to issue up to two individual disability parking placards or decals upon request.]

Provides that temporary duplicate disabled person parking permit may be renewed by mail.

Provides that temporary duplicate permit is valid for 120 days. Becomes operative on July 6, 2020.

2 Relating to disability parking permits; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 811.602.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 811.602, as amended by section 3, chapter 69, Oregon Laws 2018, is amended
5 to read:

6 811.602. (1) A disabled person parking permit is a means of identifying vehicles being used to
7 exercise the parking privileges described in ORS 811.635. The following are disabled person parking
8 permits:

9 (a) A special decal described in ORS 811.605 issued by the Department of Transportation to be
10 affixed to a golf cart or substantially similar vehicle;

11 (b) An individual placard described in ORS 811.605;

12 (c) A program placard issued by the department under ORS 811.607;

13 (d) A family placard issued by the department under ORS 811.609;

14 (e) A foreign visitor placard issued by the department under ORS 811.611;

15 (f) A "Wheelchair User" placard or decal issued by the department under ORS 811.613; and

16 (g) An "Oregon Wounded Warrior" placard or decal issued by the department under section 2,
17 chapter 69, Oregon Laws 2018.

18 (2) The department shall issue a disabled person parking permit in the form of a decal or indi-
19 vidual placard to any person who submits an application that complies with ORS 811.604. Nothing
20 in this section prohibits the department from issuing a decal or individual placard to a person who
21 has disabled veteran registration plates issued under ORS 805.100 and who qualifies for the decal
22 or placard.

23 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the department may not issue more than one
24 individual placard to an applicant. The department may issue a replacement placard upon receipt
25 of proof satisfactory to the department that the original placard has been lost, mutilated or de-
26 stroyed. The department may issue a temporary duplicate permit to a person who needs a duplicate

1 permit for travel purposes. A temporary duplicate permit shall be valid for 30 days. The department
2 shall adopt rules governing application for and issuance of temporary duplicate permits. Nothing in
3 this subsection prohibits issuance of an individual placard to a person who has been issued a decal.

4 (4) Permits issued under this section[, *other than temporary duplicate permits,*] may be renewed
5 by mail.

6 (5) Permits for use on vehicles that are regularly used as part of a program for the transporta-
7 tion of persons with disabilities are issued as provided in ORS 811.607.

8 (6) Except as provided in subsection (7) of this section, the department shall determine the form,
9 size and content of any decal or placard issued under this section and shall adopt rules governing
10 their issuance, display and use as necessary to carry out this section.

11 (7)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, the department may not require a
12 decal or placard issued under this section to an individual or a family to contain any identifying
13 information about the person to whom the decal or placard is issued, including any of the following:

- 14 (A) Name;
- 15 (B) Address;
- 16 (C) Telephone number;
- 17 (D) Social Security number;
- 18 (E) Driver license number;
- 19 (F) Golf cart driver permit number;
- 20 (G) Identification card number;
- 21 (H) Passport or visa number; or
- 22 (I) Photograph.

23 (b) The department may require a decal or placard issued under this section to an individual
24 or a family to contain not more than four digits of the driver license or identification card number
25 of the person to whom the decal or placard is issued.

26 **SECTION 2.** ORS 811.602, as amended by section 3, chapter 69, Oregon Laws 2018, and section
27 1 of this 2019 Act, is amended to read:

28 811.602. (1) A disabled person parking permit is a means of identifying vehicles being used to
29 exercise the parking privileges described in ORS 811.635. The following are disabled person parking

43 has disabled veteran registration plates issued under ORS 805.100 and who qualifies for the decal
44 or placard.

45 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the department may not issue more than one

1 individual placard to an applicant. The department may issue a replacement placard upon receipt
2 of proof satisfactory to the department that the original placard has been lost, mutilated or de-
3 stroyed. The department may issue a temporary duplicate permit to a person who needs a duplicate
4 permit for travel purposes. A temporary duplicate permit shall be valid for [30] 120 days. The de-
5 partment shall adopt rules governing application for and issuance of temporary duplicate permits.
6 Nothing in this subsection prohibits issuance of an individual placard to a person who has been is-
7 sued a decal.

8 (4) Permits issued under this section may be renewed by mail.

9 (5) Permits for use on vehicles that are regularly used as part of a program for the transporta-
10 tion of persons with disabilities are issued as provided in ORS 811.607.

11 (6) Except as provided in subsection (7) of this section, the department shall determine the form,
12 size and content of any decal or placard issued under this section and shall adopt rules governing
13 their issuance, display and use as necessary to carry out this section.

14 (7)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, the department may not require a
15 decal or placard issued under this section to an individual or a family to contain any identifying
16 information about the person to whom the decal or placard is issued, including any of the following:

17 (A) Name;

18 (B) Address;

19 (C) Telephone number;

20 (D) Social Security number;

21 (E) Driver license number;

22 (F) Golf cart driver permit number;

23 (G) Identification card number;

24 (H) Passport or visa number; or

25 (I) Photograph.

26 (b) The department may require a decal or placard issued under this section to an individual
27 or a family to contain not more than four digits of the driver license or identification card number
28 of the person to whom the decal or placard is issued.

29 **SECTION 3. The amendments to ORS 811.602 by section 2 of this 2019 Act become oper-**
30 **ative on July 6, 2020.**

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
