## House Bill 3012

Sponsored by Representative BONHAM (at the request of Oregon Foster Families First)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Directs Department of Human Services to conduct study that identifies ways to improve foster care system in this state and present report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to human services on or before September 15, 2019.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A	RILL	FOR	AN	ACT

- Relating to foster care; and declaring an emergency.
  - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Department of Human Services shall conduct a study that identifies ways to improve the foster care system in this state. The department shall, when performing the study, review the audit and data collected by the Secretary of State regarding the foster care system. The department shall prepare a report detailing the results of the study. At a minimum the report must describe:
  - (a) Ways to reduce foster care caseworker caseloads by at least 10 percent from current levels:
    - (b) The costs related to reducing foster care caseworker caseloads;
    - (c) The number of children in each county who are in foster care; and
    - (d) The payment rate necessary to attract related and nonrelated foster parents and reduce current turnover rates.
    - (2) The department shall present the report, and may include recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to human services, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, on or before September 15, 2019.
      - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2, 2021.
    - <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect on its passage.
