House Bill 3052

Sponsored by Representative BOLES; Representatives NOBLE, PILUSO, Senator HEARD

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Human Services to report to Legislative Assembly regarding transition to centralized child abuse hotline call center by May 1, 2019. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to child abuse hotline; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> No later than May 1, 2019, the Department of Human Services shall submit
a report to the appropriate committees of the Legislative Assembly regarding the status of
the centralization of the child abuse hotline described in ORS 417.805, including the following:
(1) The number of staffing vacancies as of April 1, 2019, in the new centralized child abuse
hotline call center and an explanation for the number of vacancies.

9 (2) The number of child abuse reports initiated on or before April 1, 2019, that have not 10 been closed at screening or assigned for assessment, or that are pending or incomplete due 11 to the screener's workload.

12 (3) In the six-month period ending April 1, 2019, the average:

13 (a) Monthly volume of calls in aggregate and per screener.

14 (b) Length of time a caller was placed on hold.

15 (c) Number of calls that were disconnected by callers who were placed on hold.

(4) A description of any other delays that are affecting the department's successful
 transition to the centralized child abuse hotline call center.

(5) Recommendations for legislative changes required, if any, for the department to suc cessfully implement the transition to the centralized child abuse hotline call center.

(6) A request for additional appropriations, if any, necessary for the department to suc cessfully implement the transition to the centralized child abuse hotline call center.

22 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 23 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect 24 on its passage.
