House Bill 3098

Sponsored by Representative SCHOUTEN (at the request of Darin Campbell for Working Dogs Oregon)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Creates offense of misrepresenting dog as service dog. Makes first or second offense within five-year period punishable by fine of not less than \$500 and not more than \$750. Makes third or subsequent offense within five-year period punishable by not more than 30 days' imprisonment, \$1,250 fine, or both.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to misrepresenting a dog as a service dog.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section: 4

 $\mathbf{5}$ (a) "Disability" means a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or 6 more major life activities of the individual.

- 7 (b) "Place of public accommodation" has the meaning given that term in ORS 659A.400.
- 8 (c) "Posted" means having a durable notice in a conspicuous location near each public 9 entry.

- 10 (d) "Service dog" means a dog that:
- 11 (A) Has been individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an indi-

12vidual that directly relate to a disability of the individual; or

13(B) Is undergoing a course of development and training to do work or perform tasks for 14 the benefit of an individual that directly relate to a disability of the individual.

(2) A person commits the offense of misrepresenting a dog as a service dog if: 15

- 16 (a) The person brings a dog into a place of public accommodation;
- 17 (b) The dog is not a service dog;
- 18 (c) The place is posted to inform visitors that dogs other than service dogs are not welcome at the place; and 19
- 20 (d)(A) In response to an inquiry by an owner or employee of the place of public accom-21modation, falsely asserts that the animal is a service dog; or

22(B) There is affixed to the dog any false information or improper identification vest, tag, 23 license, permit or other device that falsely portrays the dog as a service dog.

- 24 (3) Misrepresenting a dog as a service dog is:
- 25(a) For a first or second offense committed during any five-year period, an unclassified 26 violation, subject to a fine of not less than \$500 and not more than \$750.
- 27(b) For a third or subsequent offense during any five-year period, a Class C misdemeanor.
