## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Creates offense of unlawfully summoning a police officer. Punishes by maximum of \$250 fine.

Provides that person other than enforcement officer may commence violation proceeding.]

Creates civil cause of action [for person injured by commission of unlawfully summoning a] against person who knowingly summons police officer for reason other than suspected criminal activity with intent to cause specified harm.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to unlawfully summoning a police officer.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- SECTION 1. (1) A person may bring a civil action for damages against any person who knowingly causes a police officer to arrive at a location to contact another person for a reason other than suspected criminal activity and with the intent to:
- (a) Infringe on the other person's rights under the Oregon or United States Consti-8 tutions;
  - (b) Unlawfully discriminate against the other person;
    - (c) Cause the other person to feel harassed, humiliated or embarrassed;
- (d) Cause the other person to be expelled from a place in which the other person is law-11 12 fully located; or
  - (e) Damage the other person's:
- (A) Reputation or standing within the community; or 14
  - (B) Financial, economic, consumer or business prospects or interests.
- (2) Upon prevailing in an action under this section, the plaintiff may recover: 16

- (A) Special and general damages, including damages for emotional distress; or
- (B) Statutory damages of \$250 against each defendant found liable under this section; and 19
- (b) Punitive damages. 20
- (3) The court may award reasonable attorney fees to the prevailing plaintiff in an action 21 under this section. 22
  - (4) A civil action under this section:
  - (a) May be brought in the small claims department of a circuit court if the total damages do not exceed the jurisdictional limit of the small claims department.
