

House Bill 3296

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY (at the request of Representative Jeff Barker)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to conduct study on relationship between recidivism rates and length of prison sentences and present report on findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2020.

Sunsets January 2, 2021.

2 Relating to sentencing.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall conduct a study on the re-**
5 **lationship between recidivism rates and the length of prison sentences and present the re-**
6 **sults of the study, along with any recommended legislative changes, in a report to the**
7 **interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary in the manner pro-**
8 **vided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2020.**

9 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2, 2021.**
