Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and certain federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by department for certain purposes.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from certain federal funds. Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Appropriates moneys to Emergency Board for allocation to department.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2019.

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SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from federal funds, excluding federal funds described in section 2 of this 2019

SECTION 4. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, expenditures by the Department of Human Services for federal supplemental nutrition assistance payments are not limited.

SECTION 5. (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$4,000,000, to be allocated to the Department of Human Services to support implementation of the federal Family First Prevention Services Act by increasing capacity to provide in-home and evidence-based services.

(2) If any of the moneys appropriated by subsection (1) of this section are not allocated by the Emergency Board prior to December 1, 2020, the moneys remaining on that date become available for any purpose for which the Emergency Board lawfully may allocate funds.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect July 1, 2019.

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
