SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Transportation for certain biennial expenses.

Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscella-neous Receipts and certain federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by department.

Limits certain biennial expenditures by department from other federal funds. Limits certain biennial expenditures by department from lottery moneys.

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Modifies certain limitations on expenditures by department for biennium ending June 30, 2019.

Declares emergency, effective [July 1, 2019] on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the financial administration of the Department of Transportation; and declaring an 2 3 emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. There is appropriated to the Department of Transportation, for the biennium $\mathbf{5}$ beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$25,314,930 for debt service 6 7 on safety improvement projects and the State Radio Project.

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts 8 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, as the maximum limits for payment 9 of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and fed-10 eral funds received as reimbursement from the United States Department of Transportation, 11 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or re-12 ceived by the Department of Transportation, for the following purposes: 13

other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received as reimburse ment from the United States Department of Transportation, but excluding lottery funds and

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- 1 federal funds not described in section 4, chapter 604, Oregon Laws 2017, collected or received
- 2 by the Department of Transportation, for the local government program, is decreased by
- 3 **\$29,146,011.**

4 <u>SECTION 9.</u> This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 5 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect 6 on its passage.

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
