

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 5046

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after the semicolon insert “creating new provisions; amending sec-
2 tion 2, chapter 592, Oregon Laws 2017; repealing section 123, chapter 702, Oregon Laws 2017;”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 15 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**
5 **expenditures established by section 3, chapter 555, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-**
6 **ing June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds collected**
7 **or received by the Commission for the Blind, is increased by \$963,482 for expending supple-**
8 **mental award from the United States Department of Education and carryforward funds from**
9 **the Vocational Rehabilitation Grant.**

10 **“SECTION 2.** Section 2, chapter 592, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

11 **“Sec. 2.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are estab-
12 lished for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from
13 fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and including federal funds from
14 the United States Forest Service for fire protection and for research projects, but excluding lottery
15 funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or received by the State Forestry
16 Department, for the following purposes:

- 18 (2) Fire protection..... \$ 73,073,033
- 19 (3) State forests \$ 92,937,670
- 20 (4) Private forests \$ 10,777,171
- 21 (5) Capital improvement \$ 4,608,658

- 23 **(6) Debt service program**
- 24 **(a) Debt service \$ 727,883**
- 25 **(b) Bond issuance and**
- 26 **related expenses..... \$ 1,035,000**
- 27 (7) Equipment pool..... \$ 16,653,089
- 28 (8) Facilities maintenance
- 29 and management..... \$ 5,435,565

30 **“SECTION 3.** Section 123, chapter 702, Oregon Laws 2017, is repealed.

31 **“SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation
32 made to the State Forestry Department by section 1 (2), chapter 592, Oregon Laws 2017, for
33 the biennium ending June 30, 2019, is increased by \$31,545,752 for the payment of emergency
34 firefighting costs associated with the 2018 forest fire season.

35 **“SECTION 5.** (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appro-

1 **priation made to the Water Resources Department by section 1 (1), chapter 606, Oregon Laws**
2 **2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for administrative services, is decreased by**
3 **\$319,930.**

4 **“(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made**
5 **to the Water Resources Department by section 1 (2), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2017, for the**
6 **biennium ending June 30, 2019, for field services, is decreased by \$266,000.**

7 **“(3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made**
8 **to the Water Resources Department by section 1 (3), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2017, for the**
9 **biennium ending June 30, 2019, for water rights and adjudications, is decreased by \$200,000.**

10 **“(4) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made**
11 **to the Water Resources Department by section 1 (4), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2017, for the**
12 **biennium ending June 30, 2019, for technical services, is increased by \$19,611.**

13 **“(5) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made**
14 **to the Water Resources Department by section 1 (5), chapter 606, Oregon Laws 2017, for the**
15 **biennium ending June 30, 2019, for the director’s office, is increased by \$766,319.**

16 **“SECTION 6. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the expenditure limi-**
17 **tation established by section 120, chapter 702, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending**
18 **June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other**
19 **revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds,**
20 **collected or received by the Department of State Lands, from the Portland Harbor Cleanup**
21 **Fund established by section 11, chapter 748, Oregon Laws 2017, is decreased by \$6,235,000.**

22 **“SECTION 7. (1) The amount of \$12,000,000 is transferred from the Common School Fund**
23 **to the Portland Harbor Cleanup Fund established by section 11, chapter 748, Oregon Laws**
24 **2017, to be used for the purposes specified in that section, subject to subsection (2) of this**
25 **section.**

26 **“(2) The transferred amount must be separately accounted for and may be used only for**
27 **purposes permissible under Article VIII, section 5, of the Oregon Constitution.**

28 **“SECTION 7a. (1) The amount of \$12,000,000 is transferred from the State Highway Fund**
29 **to the Portland Harbor Cleanup Fund established by section 11, chapter 748, Oregon Laws**
30 **2017, to be used for the purposes specified in that section, subject to subsection (2) of this**
31 **section.**

32 **“(2) The transferred amount must be separately accounted for and may be used only for**
33 **purposes permissible under Article IX, section 3a, of the Oregon Constitution.**

34 **“SECTION 8. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**
35 **expenditures established by section 1 (1), chapter 375, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium**
36 **ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys, or**
37 **other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal**
38 **funds, collected or received by the Department of State Lands, for Common School Fund**
39 **programs, is increased by \$4,922,972 for expenses associated with the cleanup efforts at the**
40 **Goble, Oregon, site on the Columbia River.**

41 **“SECTION 9. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation**
42 **made to the Land Use Board of Appeals by section 1, chapter 536, Oregon Laws 2017, for the**
43 **biennium ending June 30, 2019, is increased by \$62,368 for unanticipated personal services**
44 **costs.**

45 **“SECTION 10. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**

1 expenditures established by section 2, chapter 373, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-
2 ing June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other
3 revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds,
4 collected or received by the Oregon Board of Naturopathic Medicine, is increased by \$100,000
5 for the payment of costs associated with a new licensing database.

6 **“SECTION 11.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
7 expenditures established by section 4, chapter 373, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-
8 ing June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other
9 revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds,
10 collected or received by the Board of Medical Imaging, is increased by \$60,000 for the pay-
11 ment of costs associated with a new licensing database.

12 **“SECTION 12.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
13 expenditures established by section 6, chapter 373, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-
14 ing June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other
15 revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds,
16 collected or received by the Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board, is increased
17 by \$100,000 for the payment of costs associated with a new licensing database.

18 **“SECTION 13.** (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the expenditure
19 limitation established by section 2 (1), chapter 572, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-
20 ing June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other
21 revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received from charges, but ex-
22 cluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 572, Oregon Laws
23 2017, collected or received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the
24 Chief Operating Office, is increased by \$29,866.

25 **“(2)** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the expenditure limitation es-
26 tablished by section 2 (7), chapter 572, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30,
27 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues,
28 including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received from charges, but excluding lot-
29 tery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 572, Oregon Laws 2017, col-
30 lected or received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for Enterprise
31 Goods and Services, is increased by \$253,258.

32 **“NOTE:** Section 14 was deleted by amendment. Subsequent sections were not renumbered.

33 **“SECTION 15.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
34 expenditures established by section 4 (1), chapter 544, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
35 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
36 other than those described in section 2, chapter 544, Oregon Laws 2017, collected or received
37 by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, for the Fish Division, is decreased by
38 \$1,700,000.

39 **“SECTION 16.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
40 expenditures established by section 4 (2), chapter 544, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
41 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds,
42 other than those described in section 2, chapter 544, Oregon Laws 2017, collected or received
43 by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, for the Wildlife Division, is increased by
44 \$1,700,000.

45 **“SECTION 17.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on

1 expenditures established by section 6 (1), chapter 595, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
2 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
3 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds, federal funds
4 and funds described in sections 9 and 10, chapter 595, Oregon Laws 2017, collected or received
5 by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for operations, is increased by \$125,000
6 for expending the funds of a grant from the Lumina Foundation.

7 **“SECTION 18.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
8 expenditures established by section 6 (1), chapter 595, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
9 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
10 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds, federal funds
11 and funds described in sections 9 and 10, chapter 595, Oregon Laws 2017, collected or received
12 by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for operations, is increased by \$40,700 for
13 the costs of administering the Volunteers program grant.

14 **“SECTION 19.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
15 expenditures established by section 5 (1), chapter 590, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
16 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of grants-in-aid, program costs and
17 purchased services from federal funds, other than those described in sections 4 and 10,
18 chapter 590, Oregon Laws 2017, received by the Department of Education, for early learning
19 programs, is increased by \$1,010,625 for a pilot project to provide child care for infants and
20 toddlers.

21 **“SECTION 20.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
22 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 582, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
23 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
24 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
25 funds, collected or received by the Public Defense Services Commission, for professional
26 services, is decreased by \$90,000.

27 **“SECTION 21.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
28 expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 582, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
29 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
30 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
31 funds, collected or received by the Public Defense Services Commission, for the Contract and
32 Business Services Division, is increased by \$90,000.

33 **“SECTION 22.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
34 ation made to the Public Defense Services Commission by section 1 (2), chapter 582, Oregon
35 Laws 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for professional services, is increased by
36 \$4,493,458.

37 **“SECTION 23.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
38 ation made to the Department of Justice by section 1 (6), chapter 576, Oregon Laws 2017, for
39 the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for the Division of Child Support, is decreased by
40 \$1,343,260 for the child support enforcement automated system project.

41 **“SECTION 24.** There is appropriated to the Department of Justice, for the biennium
42 ending June 30, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,343,260, for system develop-
43 ment costs for the child support enforcement automated system.

44 **“SECTION 25.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
45 ation made to the Department of Justice by section 1 (5), chapter 576, Oregon Laws 2017, for

1 the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for the defense of criminal convictions, is increased by
2 \$700,000.

3 “SECTION 26. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
4 ation made to the Department of Justice by section 1, chapter 535, Oregon Laws 2017, for the
5 biennium ending June 30, 2019, for the payment of expenses of district attorneys, is increased
6 by \$350,000.

7 “SECTION 27. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
8 ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (1), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017,
9 for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for operations and health services, is increased by
10 \$30,381,426.

11 “SECTION 28. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
12 ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (2), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017,
13 for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for central administration and administrative services,
14 is increased by \$11,133,885.

15 “SECTION 29. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
16 ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (3), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017,
17 for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for offender management and rehabilitation, is de-
18 creased by \$2,000,000.

19 “SECTION 30. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
20 ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (4), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017,
21 for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for community corrections, is increased by \$1,504,245.

22 “SECTION 31. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
23 ation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (6), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017,
24 for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for capital improvements, is decreased by \$1,276,717.

25 “SECTION 32. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
26 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
27 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
28 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
29 funds, collected or received by the Department of Corrections, for operations and health
30 services, is increased by \$4,902,939.

31 “SECTION 33. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
32 expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
33 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
34 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
35 funds, collected or received by the Department of Corrections, for central administration and
36 administrative services, is decreased by \$6,384,560.

37 “SECTION 34. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
38 expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
39 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
40 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
41 funds, collected or received by the Department of Corrections, for offender management and
42 rehabilitation, is increased by \$591,035.

43 “SECTION 35. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
44 expenditures established by section 2 (4), chapter 573, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
45 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or

1 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
2 funds, collected or received by the Department of Corrections, for community corrections,
3 is increased by \$890,587.

4 “SECTION 36. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
5 ation made to the Department of State Police by section 1 (4), chapter 581, Oregon Laws 2017,
6 for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for administrative services, agency support, criminal
7 justice information services and the office of the State Fire Marshal, is increased by
8 \$6,665,000.

9 “SECTION 37. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
10 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 581, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
11 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
12 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
13 funds, collected or received by the Department of State Police, for patrol services, criminal
14 investigations and gaming enforcement, is increased by \$4,100,000.

15 “SECTION 38. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
16 expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 581, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
17 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
18 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
19 funds, collected or received by the Department of State Police, for fish and wildlife enforce-
20 ment, is increased by \$2,900,000.

21 “SECTION 39. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
22 expenditures established by section 2 (4), chapter 581, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
23 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
24 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
25 funds, collected or received by the Department of State Police, for administrative services,
26 agency support, criminal justice information services and the office of the State Fire Mar-
27 shal, is decreased by \$7,000,000.

28 “SECTION 40. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
29 ation made to the Oregon Military Department by section 1 (1), chapter 566, Oregon Laws
30 2017, for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for administration, is increased by \$50,100.

31 “SECTION 41. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
32 expenditures established by section 2 (4), chapter 566, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium
33 ending June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
34 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and reimbursements from federal service
35 agreements, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter
36 566, Oregon Laws 2017, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department, for com-
37 munity support, is increased by \$3,850,000.

38 “SECTION 42. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
39 expenditures established by section 4, chapter 510, Oregon Laws 2017, for the biennium end-
40 ing June 30, 2019, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds collected
41 or received by the State Library, is increased by \$140,000.

42 “SECTION 43. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
43 ation made to the Emergency Board by section 1, chapter 702, Oregon Laws 2017, for the
44 biennium ending June 30, 2019, as modified by legislative or Emergency Board action, is de-
45 creased by \$57,255,961.

 2 and expenditure limitations for the biennium ending June 30, 2019, for the following agencies
