House Concurrent Resolution 30

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

In memoriam: Ricky John Best, 1964-2017.

1	CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	Whereas Ricky John Best was born on February 7, 1964; and
3	Whereas Ricky John Best grew up in Oregon, mostly in Salem, and attended Vocational Village
4	High School in Portland; and
5	Whereas Ricky John Best attended Portland Community College, where he met his future wife
6	Myhanh Duong Best; and
7	Whereas Ricky John Best served in the United States Army for 23 years, including deployments
8	to Iraq and Afghanistan; and
9	Whereas Ricky John Best was an outstanding soldier who served his country with honor and
10	distinction, and he retired from the Army with the rank of Staff Sergeant; and
11	Whereas after retiring from the Army, Ricky John Best resided with his family in Happy Valley
12	Oregon; and
13	Whereas in 2014, Ricky John Best was a candidate for Clackamas County commissioner; and
14	Whereas in January 2015, Ricky John Best began working for the City of Portland, where he
15	was a dedicated employee in the Bureau of Development Services who was widely respected and
16	liked by his colleagues; and
17	Whereas on the afternoon of May 26, 2017, while aboard a Metropolitan Area Express (MAX)
18	train approaching Hollywood Transit Center in Portland, Jeremy Joseph Christian began screaming
19	anti-Muslim sentiments and verbally harassing two young women, one of whom was wearing a hijab

21	Whereas Ricky John Best was on that MAX train, returning home to his family, and he and two
22	fellow passengers, Taliesin Myrddin Namkai-Meche and Micah David-Cole Fletcher, selflessly inter-
23	vened in the increasingly frightening situation, coming to the aid of the two young women and at
24	tempting to placate Christian; and
25	Whereas Christian viciously attacked all three men with a knife, wounding Fletcher and killing
26	Best and Namkai-Meche; and
27	Whereas Best, Namkai-Meche and Fletcher acted with courage and conviction, without regard
28	for their own personal safety, standing up to hate and coming to the aid of others; and
29	Whereas tributes to Best, Namkai-Meche and Fletcher poured in from all over the world, and
30	thousands of people gathered at candlelight vigils to pay their respects and to leave tokens of ap-
31	preciation at a spontaneous memorial at Hollywood Transit Center; and

Whereas a permanent memorial at Hollywood Transit Center, in the form of a mural titled "We

- 1 Choose Love," now honors Best, Namkai-Meche and Fletcher and pays tribute to their strength and 2 courage; and
- Whereas Ricky John Best "couldn't just stand by and do nothing" and he "died fighting the good fight, protecting the innocent," in the words of his son Erik; and
 - Whereas Ricky John Best's funeral was held at Christ the King Catholic Church in Milwaukie, Oregon, and his three teenage sons helped to lift his casket into the hearse; and
 - Whereas the funeral procession to the cemetery was led by a police escort and first responders and members of the public lined the streets to honor Ricky John Best; and
 - Whereas Ricky John Best was laid to rest with military honors at Willamette National Cemetery; and
 - Whereas Ricky John Best was a devoted and loving husband and father who is survived by his wife, Myhanh, his daughter, Tramanh, and his three sons, Erik, Isaac and David; now, therefore,
