House Concurrent Resolution 34

Sponsored by Representatives SMITH DB, BARKER, Senator ROBLAN, Representative CLEM

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Expresses support for continued coordination and collaboration between Oregon and China.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Whereas over the past two decades, Oregon's business ties and relationships with China have increased considerably; and

Whereas since the Great Recession, China has been Oregon's top destination for exports of merchandise goods (or physical products), and the total value of these exports has exceeded \$6 billion in recent years; and

Whereas Oregon's exports to China have supported more than 31,200 American jobs since 2016; and

Whereas Oregon's agricultural exports to China amounted to more than \$235 million in 2017, which means a great deal to Oregon farmers; and

Whereas more students from China attend higher education institutions in Oregon than students from any other country; and

Whereas China is Oregon's foremost source of international visitors, with more than 60,000 Chinese citizens visiting Oregon annually, providing a tremendous boost to Oregon's tourism industry; and

Whereas in 2019, we celebrate the 35th anniversary of friendly relations between Oregon and Fujian Province and the fifth anniversary of friendly relations between Oregon and Tianjin Municipality; and

Whereas in 2019, we celebrate the 40th anniversary of formal diplomatic relations between the United States and China, and we respect the Three Communiqués that continue to play a crucial role in the ongoing dialogue between the two nations; and

Whereas the Oregon China Council (formerly the Oregon-China Sister State Relations Council) continues to work with the Oregon-China Sister State Committee to further enhance people-to-people exchanges, trade, education, culture, environmental initiatives, sporting events and investment opportunities between Oregon and China; and

Whereas the cultures of Oregon and China share a genuine and irrepressible friendliness, entrepreneurial spirit, decency, politeness, optimism, warmth and earnestness that are the foundation for a bright future between our people; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

That we, the members of the Eightieth Legislative Assembly, actively support continued coordination and collaboration between Oregon and China to increase mutual understanding and strengthen a mutual economic development relationship; and be it further
