2	" <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Secretary of State shall conduct a study and analyze the impact of
3	special elections that the Legislative Assembly has ordered since January 1, 2015.
4	"(2) As part of the study conducted under subsection (1) of this section, the secretary
5	shall analyze:
6	"(a) Whether the special elections described in subsection (1) of this section created
7	barriers to the ability of electors to vote. This analysis must specifically consider whether
8	the special elections have had a disproportionate impact on the ability to vote by:
9	"(A) Minority communities;
10	"(B) Members of a protected class, as defined in ORS 279A.112;
11	"(C) Veterans, as defined in ORS 408.225, who use absentee ballots to vote; and
12	"(D) Persons with a disability, as defined in ORS 410.600.
13	"(b) The percentage of eligible electors in rural and nonurban communities who voted in
14	the special elections described in subsection (1) of this section in comparison to the per-
15	centage of eligible electors in rural and nonurban communities who voted in the primary and
16	general elections held since January 1, 2015.
17	"(c) The total financial cost to the state to hold the special elections described in sub-
18	section (1) of this section.
19	"(d) The total financial cost to counties in this state to hold the special elections de-
20	scribed in subsection (1) of this section.
21	"(3) The secretary shall submit a report, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, setting
22	forth the findings of the study, to the interim legislative committees on rules no later than
23	January 1, 2021.
24	" <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2, 2022.".
