SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Directs Board of Medical Imaging to issue permit to supervise fluoroscopy to qualified advanced practice registered nurse. Authorizes Board of Medical Imaging, Oregon State Board of Nursing and Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to supervision of fluoroscopy; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:**

5 (a) **"Advanced practice registered nurse" means a person who meets the requirements**
6 **of ORS 678.025.**

7 (b) **"Fluoroscopy" has the meaning given that term in ORS 688.510.**

8 (c) **"Medical imaging licensee" has the meaning given that term in ORS 688.405.**

9 (d) **"Radiography" has the meaning given that term in ORS 688.405.**

10 (e) **"Supervise fluoroscopy" means to provide direction to and consult with the medical**
11 **imaging licensee who specializes in radiography and who is operating the fluoroscopic X-ray**
12 **equipment.**

13 (2) **Except as provided in subsection (5) of this section, an advanced practice registered**
14 **nurse may not supervise fluoroscopy unless the advanced practice registered nurse:**

15 (a) **Holds an active permit issued by the Board of Medical Imaging issued under this**
16 **section;**

17 (b) **Supervises fluoroscopy only while a medical imaging licensee who specializes in**
18 **radiography is operating the fluoroscopic X-ray equipment; and**

19 (c) **Complies with this section and any rule adopted by the Board of Medical Imaging, the**
20 **Oregon State Board of Nursing and the Oregon Health Authority related to fluoroscopy.**

21 (3) **The Board of Medical Imaging shall issue a permit to supervise fluoroscopy to an**
22 **advanced practice registered nurse who:**

23 (a) **Meets any educational and examination requirements, and pays any related fees, es-**
24 **tablished by the Board of Medical Imaging, the Oregon State Board of Nursing and the au-**
25 **thority;**

26 (b) **Submits an application to the Board of Medical Imaging in a form and manner pre-**

1 scribed by the board;

2 (c) Pays a permit application fee established by the board by rule; and

3 (d) Meets the standards of ethical and professional conduct established by a credentialing
4 organization or professional society related to the practice of medical imaging, as approved
5 by the board by rule.

6 (4) The Board of Medical Imaging shall renew a permit issued under this section if the
7 advanced practice registered nurse:

8 (a) Submits a renewal application to the board in a form and manner prescribed by the
9 board;

10 (b) Pays a renewal fee established by the board by rule; and

11 (c) Completes any continuing education required by the board by rule.

12 (5)(a) An advanced practice registered nurse may, under the supervision of a physician
13 licensed under ORS chapter 677 or an advanced practice registered nurse who holds a permit
14 issued under this section, supervise fluoroscopy as part of an educational plan or program
15 for the purpose of meeting any educational requirements to be eligible for a permit under
16 this section.

17 (b) Fluoroscopic X-ray equipment used under this subsection must be operated by a
18 medical imaging licensee who specializes in radiography.

19 (6) Nothing in this section authorizes an advanced practice registered nurse to operate
20 fluoroscopic X-ray equipment.

21 (7) A person other than a physician licensed under ORS chapter 677 or an advanced
22 practice registered nurse authorized under this section may not supervise fluoroscopy unless
23 specifically allowed by law.

24 (8) Subject to the provisions of ORS chapter 183, the Board of Medical Imaging may re-
25 fuse to issue or renew a permit under this section or may suspend or revoke a permit under
26 this section if the applicant or permit holder violates a provision of this section or a rule
27 adopted by the Board of Medical Imaging, the Oregon State Board of Nursing or the au-
28 thority related to fluoroscopy.

29 (9) The Board of Medical Imaging, the Oregon State Board of Nursing and the authority
30 may adopt rules as necessary to carry out this section. Any rules adopted under this section
31 must include rules establishing a waiver process through which an advanced practice regis-
32 tered nurse may submit documentation demonstrating sufficient experience or education to
33 exempt the advanced practice registered nurse from any clinical or didactic educational re-
34 quirements adopted by the Board of Medical Imaging under subsection (3) of this section.

35 **SECTION 2.** (1) Section 1 of this 2019 Act becomes operative on January 1, 2020.

36 (2) The Board of Medical Imaging, the Oregon State Board of Nursing and the Oregon
37 Health Authority may take any action before the operative date specified in subsection (1)
38 of this section that is necessary to enable the boards and the authority to exercise, on and
39 after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions
40 and powers conferred on the boards and the authority by section 1 of this 2019 Act.

41 **SECTION 3.** This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
42 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect
43 on its passage.
