SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to [establish] convene stakeholders to facilitate establishment of foster youth success centers in each public university. [Authorizes issuance of] Allocates lottery [bonds] funds to finance cost of developing foster

[Authorizes issuance of] Allocates lottery [bonds] funds to finance cost of developing foster youth success centers in public universities. Establishes Foster Youth Success Center Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in fund to commission. Directs commission to use moneys in fund to finance development of foster youth success centers to assist foster youth attending public universities.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

Relating to foster youth success centers; and declaring an emergency.

SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "Foster Youth Promise student" means a student enrolled in community college or a public university listed in ORS 352.002 who is entitled to a tuition waiver under ORS 350.300. (2) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall convene a representative group of community college and public university stakeholders in order to facilitate the establishment of foster youth success centers in each public university. (3) Foster youth success centers established pursuant to this section shall: (a) Develop and implement peer support programs for Foster Youth Promise students; (b) Provide outreach and mentoring to advise foster youth who are attending high school about their educational options; and (c) Develop and implement additional support programs to promote the success of Foster Youth Promise students. SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section, "Foster Youth Promise student" means a student enrolled in community college or a public university listed in ORS 352.002 who is entitled to a tuition waiver under ORS 350.300. (2) The Legislative Assembly finds that providing Foster Youth Promise students who are attending public universities with support programs as provided in section 1 of this 2019 Act will: (a) Ensure that Foster Youth Promise students succeed in their educational endeavors; (b) Positively impact the educational and career prospects of current and future Foster

2 (c) Strengthen the efficacy of the tuition waiver provided to foster youth and former 3 foster youth under ORS 350.300.

- 4 (3) The factors described in subsection (2) of this section will encourage and promote 5 economic development within the State of Oregon, and the establishment of foster youth 6 success centers is therefore an appropriate use of state lottery funds under Article XV, 7 section 4, of the Oregon Constitution, and ORS 461.510.
- (4) There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, from the Administrative 8 9 Services Economic Development Fund, to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, the amount of \$_____ for deposit in the Foster Youth Success Center Fund established under 10 section 3 of this 2019 Act, to be used for the purposes described in section 3 of this 2019 Act. 11 12SECTION 3. (1) The Foster Youth Success Center Fund is established in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund. The moneys in the Foster Youth 13 Success Center Fund and the interest earnings on moneys in the fund are continuously ap-14 15 propriated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for the purposes described in 16 subsection (2) of this section. The fund consists of moneys deposited into the fund under section 2 of this 2019 Act and may include other fees, revenues or other income transferred 17 into the fund by the Legislative Assembly for payment of costs incurred to establish the 18
- 19 Foster Youth Success Center Fund.
- (2) Moneys in the fund are available for immediate distribution to the Higher Education
 Coordinating Commission to pay the costs incurred to fund foster youth success centers
 described in section 1 of this 2019 Act.
- 23 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 24 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect 25 on its passage.
