## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 221

"SECTION 1. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Health Authority, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$6,600,000, which may be expended for intensive in-home ser-

vices for children with behavioral health needs.

"SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Oregon Health Authority, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$3,076,000, which may be expended to support statewide implementation of crisis and transition services.

"SECTION 3. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Department of Human Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$6,600,000, which may be expended beginning July 1, 2020, to support implementation of the federal Family First Prevention Services Act, 132 Stat. 232 (2018), by funding evidence-based prevention services that are flexible enough to support families in their homes, schools and communities.

"SECTION 4. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Department of Human Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$3,500,000, which may be expended for therapeutic foster care.

"SECTION 5. (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Department of Human Services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$8,400,000, which may be expended to supplement existing programs to include enhanced services for children with intellectual or developmental disabilities, including but not limited to children with intellectual or developmental disabilities who may also have behavioral health needs.

"(2) The department shall prioritize expenditures described in subsection (1) of this section for services that prevent out-of-home care or that are provided in settings that include children with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities.

"SECTION 6. This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect on July 1, 2019.".
