AN ACT

Relating to civil immunity for volunteers fighting wildfires.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:

- (a) "Voluntarily" means not undertaken as a condition of employment or with an expectation of remuneration.
- (b) "Wildfire" means a fire burning uncontrolled on private cropland, pasture, rangeland or other private agricultural land or threatening a structure on agricultural land.
- (2) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, a person that voluntarily undertakes the fighting of a wildfire is not civilly liable for any injury to person or property resulting from the good faith performance of firefighting efforts.
- (3) Subsection (2) of this section applies to the performance of firefighting efforts that commence when the person arrives at the fire scene or a staging area and end when the person departs from the fire scene or staging area.
 - (4) Subsection (2) of this section does not apply to:
- (a) Members of a volunteer fire department or fire district who have been trained in firefighting techniques; or
 - (b) The operation of a motor vehicle by a person.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2019 Act applies to injury from firefighting efforts performed on or after the effective date of this 2019 Act.
