## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 378

1	On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after "examinations" delete the rest of the line and insert
2	a period.
3	Delete lines 4 through 27 and delete page 2 and insert:
4	"SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission, in collaboration with Disa-
5	bility Rights Oregon, the Oregon Health Authority and the Judicial Department, shall con-
6	duct a study identifying barriers to the timely:
7	"(a) Completion of accurate and reliable inpatient, outpatient and privately obtained fit-
8	ness to proceed evaluations under ORS 161.365 or 161.370; and
9	"(b) Admission of defendants for inpatient fitness to proceed evaluations following an
10	order of commitment under ORS 161.365 or 161.370.
11	"(2) The commission shall present the results of the study, along with any recommended
12	legislative changes, in a report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related
13	to the judiciary in the manner provided under ORS 192.245 on or before September 15, 2021.
14	The report must include results specific to each county and must be made accessible to the
15	public.
16	"(3) All agencies of state government are directed to assist the commission in the per-
17	formance of the study and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to
18	furnish information and advice that the commission considers necessary to perform the
19	study.
20	"SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
21	priated to the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019,
22	out of the General Fund, the amount of \$50,000, to be provided to Disability Rights Oregon
23	for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of section 1 of this 2019 Act.

"SECTION 3. Section 1 of this 2019 Act is repealed on January 2, 2022.".
